After the 10:30 service that day, we'll gather in the parish hall for a lite lunch of hotdogs. and what lies hidden praise your might.

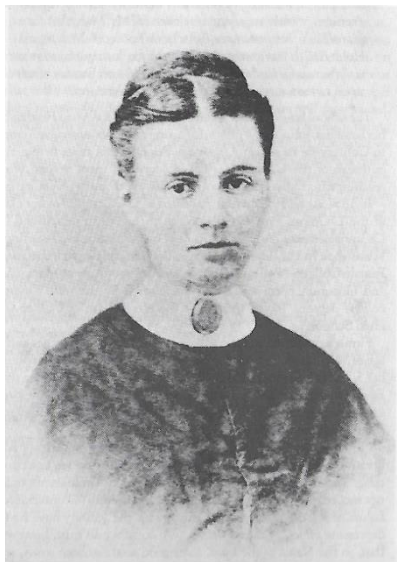
Sustaining God, your hands uphold
