MEN'S MONDAY BIBLE STUDY: The men are studying The New Testament in Antiquity, by Gary M. Burge and Gene L. Green (found at: <a href="http://masterlectures.zondervanacademic.com/new-testament-in-antiquity">http://masterlectures.zondervanacademic.com/new-testament-in-antiquity</a>). The New Testament in Antiquity skillfully develops how Jewish, Hellenistic, and Roman cultures formed the essential environment in which the New Testament authors wrote their books and letters. Throughout the video lectures, presenters Gary Burge and Gene Green provide windows into the first-century world and discuss issues of interpretation derived from cultural observations. You will learn how understanding the land, history, and culture of this world brings remarkable new insights into how we read the New Testament itself. **LADIES' TUESDAY BIBLE STUDY:** The ladies' study group is in the midst of a 12-week course on **Slaying the Giants in Your Life**, by David Jeremiah. All ladies are welcome to attend the study on Tuesdays at 10:00 AM in the parish hall.

FR. JEFF'S WEDNESDAY BIBLE STUDY: Fr. Jeff has begun a new study on Wednesdays in the parish hall at 10:00 AM. The study is on Genesis and picks up with the materials posted on Facebook and the church website (look under Worship/Reflections), with additional insights from the Church Fathers of the Christian faith. It will be a slow-motion study, trying to honor the depth to be found therein. Study notes are provided on the church website for those who want to use them as a guide. FR. CHRISTIAN'S THURSDAY BIBLE STUDY – DANIEL & ESTHER: Daniel was among the first of the captives taken by the Babylonians. Although he lived in a culture opposed to God, he was always faithful to the Lord, even in the face of death, and ultimately was able to influence kings and rulers. Esther was in exile during the time of the Persian Empire. Like Daniel, the Lord also placed her in a position to influence those in power. God also called her to step out in faith and risk her life to foil a plot against her people. As a result of her bold actions, the entire Jewish race was saved from annihilation. We will explore *Life Lessons* with Max Lucado in a series of twelve lessons with intriguing questions, inspirational stories, and poignant reflections to take you deeper into God's Word. Like Daniel and Esther, Christians are also in exile in this world and need to stay faithful and true to their Heavenly Kingdom. Books by Max Lucado, *Life Lessons from Daniel & Esther*, are on the bookshelf outside the office (\$10). Everyone is invited to attend on Thursdays at 10:00 AM in the parish hall.
