**COLLIERVILLE FOOD PANTRY:** On Thursdays in August, Saint Andrew's volunteers take whatever items have been donated by the parish over to the Food Pantry and work there from 9–11 AM. If parishioners wish to donate items, mark them "For Food Pantry" and place them on the kitchen table. The pantry always needs canned meat items (including stews and soups), cereals, beans, tuna, peanut butter, jelly, bath tissue, travel soaps and shampoos, and brown paper grocery bags. **FR. CHRISTIAN'S UPCOMING THURSDAY BIBLE STUDY:** On Aug 15 at 10:00 AM, Fr. Christian will begin a new weekly Bible study called "Colossians: Against the Tide." Colossians teaches principles for living a Christian life in the midst of a non-Christian culture. Sometimes this calls for us to stand against the tide of public opinion or popular trends. In chapter one, Paul tells the Colossian Christians that he prays for them on a regular basis, asking God to "fill [them] with the knowledge of his will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding." He goes on to say, "We pray this in order that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please him in every way..." This study will examine four components of living a life pleasing to God. It will not be necessary for attendees to purchase a book.
